



90x90 Summary Statement Lenten Season, 2012

The program 90 by 90 (**90x90**) is one to involve every single person in the congregation in service, and to stretch each person outside his or her comfort zone and into our community. It was created by Dr. Kent Millard, our Myer's Lecture speaker in 2009. The congregation will be asked to volunteer 90 minutes of their time to a charitable agency, and complete this commitment within a 90-day period beginning the first day of Lent. Ninety minutes by ninety days. An area of emphasis has been chosen: "Physical, Spiritual and Emotional Care", and agencies in our community will be contacted to attend a "**90x90 Expo**" at the church on February 12, where the congregation will sign up to volunteer. A program for the children, youth, and those unable to travel to agencies to serve, will also be established so all can participate. We will also have prayer partners for each of the 20 agencies.

Benefits of this program will be:

- Establishing links between our church and our community
- Allowing members to sample an area of service in an environment that is outside their normal environ
- The service is not for an extended length of time, so the commitment goal is easy to reach
- Individuals might find an area of need in the community to which they might commit more time in service to Christ
- Our Christian presence in the community could draw people to Christ and to our church

Toiletry Collection: Organize a collection of toiletries or basic household supplies for seniors.

Card Making: Make greeting cards for homebound seniors, who often live alone and are isolated.

All of these opportunities can be done individually or as a group or family, and are available Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. at various locations throughout Greater Cleveland. This is a “Family Friendly” agency.
