### **PEOPLE OF THE BOOK by Geraldine Brooks**

Pulitzer-prize-winning author tells the story of Hannah Heath, rare book conservator who is called upon to examine the long-lost Sarajevo Haggadah. Through her research she discovers fascinating, intertwining tales of Jews, Muslims and Christians.

### **SUMMER OF LIGHT by Dale W. Cramer**

Mick, a laid-off iron-worker, discovers a new side of himself when his wife returns to work and he stays home with his developmentally-challenged son.

### **GREEN – THE CIRCLE, BOOK 0: THE BEGINNING AND THE END by Ted Dekker**

Prequel and conclusion to the best-selling suspense series, Black, Red and White. Thomas Hunter fell asleep and woke up in the post-apocalyptic future. Now he battles the forces of evil.

### **DOGWOOD by Chris Fabry**

**2009 Christy Award winner for best contemporary Christian fiction**

10 years ago Will went to prison and Karin entered into a loveless marriage. Now Will has returned. This is a beautifully written story of sacrificial love, suffering and forgiveness.

### **BLOOD OF THE PRODIGAL by Paul L. Gaus**

An outsider is called into an Old Order Amish community in Holmes County, Ohio to find a missing boy. Reminiscent of the movie *Witness*.

### **WHEN CRICKETS CRY by Charles Martin**

A broken-hearted surgeon must replace the damaged heart of a young girl. Healing comes for both when God intertwines their lives.

### **WIDOWS AND ORPHANS by Susan Meissner**

When her brother confesses to murder, new mom and lawyer Rachel Flynn takes up his defense. First in a new series, this novel contains strong characters and a skillfully interwoven faith message.
